


Distribution of Republicans and Democrats on a 10-item scale of political values





Distribution of Democrats and Republicans on a 10-item scale of political values







Distribution of Republicans and Democrats on a 10-item scale of political values





Average gap in the share taking a conservative position across 10 political values, by key demographics



% who say relations between Republicans and Democrats in Washington will ____ in the coming year















% who say they voted for the ____ in the election for House of Representatives





Confidence in the U.S. president to do the right thing regarding world affairs


